

Developing Creative Presentations

The following are steps you can take to develop a creative presentation:

- 1. What is your topic/title?
- 2. What is the purpose of your presentation?
- 3. Make a list of places or things that you think would teach a lesson about your topic?
- 4. For each of the items on your list, write down its attributes. What are its positive and negative points?
- 5. After prayerful consideration, choose the place or thing that would best be suited to teach the purpose of your topic.
- 6. For your chosen place/thing, what can you use to make your presentation more visual?
- 7. What unique story or stories can you find to enhance the main point of your presentation? (Stories can be from the Bible, personal experience or from the news.)
- 8. Find Bible verses that will support your topic and its lessons.
- 9. Make a list of your key points (lessons) for this topic.



When developing creative presentations, keep the following key truths in mind:

- Encourage one another (Hebrews 3:13)
- Pray for one another (James 5:16)
- Build up each other's faith (1 Thessalonians 5:11)
- Teach one another (1 Timothy 4:11)
- Nurture one another (1 Corinthians 12:25)
- Forgive one another (Colossians 3:13)
- Love one another (1 Thessalonians 3:12)
- Demonstrate the Fruit of Spirit with one another (Galatians 5:22-23)
